LATEST IST PROGRAMME NEWS

Towards Framework Programme Six

The total number of complete EoIs received by the deadline of 7 June 2002 is close to 11,500, after the removal of duplicates. Each of the Thematic Priorities has now completed its analysis. Reports are being drafted for publication in September. See [here](#) for more details.

A workshop for research managers and administrators who already have some knowledge of the EU's Framework programmes will take place on 6 September in Cambridge, UK. The event will focus on IST in the Sixth Framework programme and will also cover the programme's new funding instruments, including Integrated Projects and Networks of Excellence. From 11 to 13 November 2002 the European Commission will hold a major conference in Brussels to mark the launch of the EU's Sixth Framework Programme for research, which will cover the period from 2002 to 2006. More information is available from their [website](#).

OTHER NEWS

IPv6 world records

Two 'world records' were achieved with IPv6 in recent weeks, with the support of the Euro6IX project. On August 3rd, a link over 70 Km. long was established between dual stack routers in Gran Canaria and Tenerife, under the frame of the [FICIT project](#). In the following week, more than 1200 computers were configured and tested with IPv6 in the [Valencia 2002 Campus Party](#). For this event, UPM, TID and Consulintel were working in the frame of the LONG and Euro6IX projects in order to provide the network, training and several demonstrations about new IPv6 advanced services and applications to over 3000 people.

VoIP over IPv6 available from Telscom

A Voice over IPv6 application has long been sought after by IPv6 network researchers. Due to the lack of Java support for IPv6, such an application has not been available until now. The Swiss company Telscom has successfully developed and tested a VoIPv6 application based on the Session Initiated Protocol. The application has been tested using Linux systems for both fixed and Mobile IPv6 networks. Telscom is making the documentation and the application software available to research groups free of charge.

Internet-2 has an IPv6 research network

Internet2 has announced that the nationwide Abilene backbone network now offers native next generation Internet Protocol (IPv6) service. This deployment makes high-performance IPv6 service available to over 200 Internet2 member institutions and thousands of other research and education institutions across the United States that have access to Abilene. IST IPv6 CLUSTER MEETINGS

The IST IPv6 Cluster met on 24th July in Brussels, Belgium, for a full day of discussion, interaction and some presentations. New IPv6-related projects were presented and discussed and project representatives gave updates on existing projects. Much of the meeting focussed on discussing what are the most useful activities the Cluster could undertake to support and enhance the work of the IST projects, and several possible initiatives were identified. The IPv6 Cluster has organized an IPv6 session at the IST2002 event on November 6, at 11:00, see the [agenda](#).

The next IPv6 Cluster meeting will be organized in Brussels, 11-14 November 2002, as part of the [European Research 2002](#) event. This event is a major conference to mark the launch of the EU's Sixth Framework Programme for research, which will cover the period from 2002 to 2006. The theme of our meeting will be "IPv6 in FP6 and the near Future". The All-IPv6-World workshop was organized last June 14th as part of the IPv6 Cluster activities, towards the identification of IPv6 research and development areas not properly covered in FP5, that could lead into specific activities in FP6. The meeting was very successful and the participants are working together in a specific mail exploder. This group will meet again in Brussels on October 1st. IPv6 PROJECT NEWS

Euro6IX has received from the 6Bone registry an allocation of pTLA 3FFE:4011::/32. In addition, the Euro6IX project has requested a pTLA for Internet Exchange experimentation.

6NET is running native IPv6 to 9 PoPs at 155Mbit/s using IS-IS for the IGP. It has also produced several public reports, e.g. on wireless LAN and IPv6 transition, available from the [web site](#).

The 6POWER project started in July. The [web site](#) is already available (IPv6 and IPv4), with plenty of information relevant to the project, including the first public deliverables.

6QM and IPv6 TF-SC will start next September. Soon the web sites will be available.

Eurov6 started in July. The [website](#) is available now.

IPv6 STANDARDISATION

The second IPv6 Technology Standardisation Report is available from the [IST IPv6 Cluster website](#). This report analyses the status of IPv6 standardisation as of August 2002 and highlights the key issues in various technology areas. The report includes developments in IETF, 3GPP and the RIRs. The next update will be available in December.

CONFERENCES AND WORKSHOPS

Several participants of IST projects attended the most recent IETF meeting in Yokohama (preliminary proceedings available [here](#)). Important IPv6-related decisions were made, but perhaps the most relevant observation was made by Randy Bush (one of the Operations and Management Area Directors) during the plenary session, "IPv6 isn't the future of the Internet, it's the present," he said. The plenary included a panel debate about 'Development and Deployment Experiences with IPv6'. The presentations are available [here](#). The ngtrans WG is being wound up and a new working group, v6ops, has been established. The v6ops charter is available [here](#).

The other important outcome, from the 6bone meeting, is the proposal to return the 6bone 3FFF::/16 address space to the RIR's (Regional Internet Registries), APNIC, ARIN and RIPE. Bob Fink has prepared a proposal that is under discussion on the [6Bone mail exploder](#). More information is available [here](#).

Finally, the IX WG meeting was held also in Yokohama, with interesting inputs from all the continents. Information is available [here](#).
